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

Speech by President EVVVLO Roger ROBERT:

Mr Dirk VANSINA representative of the City of Leuven

Captain Commander Luc WINDEY representative of the Provincial Command of Flemish Brabant Ladies and gentlemen,

In your degree and capacity, esteemed flag bearers I welcome you to this solemn commemoration of Lieutenant Charles Mathijs.

Who was Charles Mathijs?

Charles was someone who spent his childhood in this environment, having to work at a young age to support his family. But Charles had more abilities, his uncle taking him under his wing and sending him to a college in Brussels. Unfortunately, the invasion of World War 2 was at the door and Charles had to flee. Through Belgium, then France, to end up in Britain.

Charles Mathijs volunteered from the very beginning with the Belgian Land Forces in



the U.K. He enlisted in the parachute unit. He achieved brilliant results in the officer training centre (Officer Cadet Training Unit) where he showed himself to be an ideal chief and who paid great attention to his men.



In June 1944, he was first parachuted with a combat group behind the German lines in France to disrupt the operations of the retreating Germans.

Charles was then placed at the disposal of the British Intelligence School n°9 Western European Area. He cooperated in bringing more than 300 escaped Airmen back to their own lines. On 1 September 1944, he was parachuted into enemy territory a second time, this time in the Belgian Ardennes. Between December 1944 and January 1945, he took part in the Battle of the Bulge.

Charles Mathijs especially devoted a lot of energy to training young recruits. It was during a military manoeuvre north of Leopoldsburg that he was killed on 4 March 1945, hit by a ricocheting projectile. They went with songs tot he battle they are young

Straight of limb, true of eyes, steady and aglow

They were staunch tot he end against odds uncounted

They fell with their face tot he foe Theys hall grow not old, as wethat are left grow old

Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn

At the going down of the sun and in the morning

We will remember them.



After the floral tributes and the playing of the 'Last Post', the move was made to the city cemetery where Lt Charles Mathijs is buried.

There, the prayer of the paratroopers was recited by our president.

Lord, grant me what remains.

Give me what is otherwise never asked.

I ask You neither silence nor peace of mind.

Neither soul nor body.

No wealth or success.

Nay, not even health.

For all that, Lord,

Has so often been asked of Thee.

That Thou wouldst no longer possess it.

Lord, give me that which thou hast left.

Give me that which is too little for others;

The unsafe, the restless.

Give me the storm, the strength to fight.

Grant me all this forever, Lord

So that I may be sure to possess always.

For not always will I have the courage to ask You for this

Give me Lord, what remains.

Give me that which others will not.

But also grant me courage, strength and faith.



3.12. MEMORIAL DAY at 3th Bn Paratropers at Tielen

After a 2-year hiatus, the time had come for our friends to reunite on Memorial Day. Memorial Day, formerly known as 'Korea Day', evokes the memories of the struggle of our Belgian volunteers who were deployed to liberate South Korea from the Communist North.





June 1950, North Korean troops invaded South Korea. In response, the United Nations Security Council decided by Resolution 84 to provide military support to South Korea. Eventually, that support consisted of a force in which 15 countries participated in addition to US troops: Australia, Belgium, Canada, Colombia, Philippines, Ethiopia, France, Greece, Luxembourg, Netherlands, New

Zealand, Thailand, Turkey, United Kingdom and South Africa. All troops came under the command of the United States. US general Douglas MacArthur was appointed commander-in-chief.

On 25

After a few days, the South Korean capital Seoul was occupied and 90% of South Korea was in the hands of Northern troops by early September 1950. Only a small area around Busan still held out. Almost the South Koreans and the Americans coming to the rescue were brought to their knees, mainly because both the South Koreans and Americans were inadequately trained, morale was very low and leadership was often severely lacking.

However, partly due to the fact that the North Koreans had suffered very heavy losses during their advance and the supply routes for them had become longer and longer, the North Korean offensive slowly bled to death. In addition, reinforcements kept arriving for the Americans and South Koreans in the form of new US divisions and units from other United Nations countries. With the help of a tactical feat (the amphibious landing at Incheon, far behind the North Korean lines) and good luck, Commander MacArthur managed to push the North Koreans back to the borders of China.

At that time, the People's Republic of China intervened, partly because of the perceived threat of capitalist army units on its borders and the fact that the US was openly supporting the nationalist Chinese on the island of Formosa (present-day Taiwan), led by Chiang Kai-shek. The US deployed the 7th Fleet to protect Formosa. The attacking Chinese pushed back the

Western coalition back. Once again, Seoul fell into communist hands. On 11 April 1951, Douglas MacArthur was relieved of his post as commander of UN forces in Korea. The reason was that he had made controversial statements about a possible extension of the war into China, and about possible use of nuclear weapons (because a nuclear war was feared).

In the period that followed, the war dragged on, with successes and setbacks alternating for both sides. In mid-1951, attempts were made to start peace negotiations. These were able to begin in Kaesong on 10 July 1951. Negotiations dragged on for months and were repeatedly suspended. A major stumbling block was the exchange of prisoners of war.



To put pressure on the North Korean leaders, the Americans subjected North Korea to a merciless napalm bombardment in the last two years of the war. This killed about 500,000 people. This annual Memorial Day also commemorates the first post-war operational jumps of the 3rd Bn Para and their interventions in the former Belgian Congo.

These took place at Kindu (OPS 2Cie), Kikwit (OPS 1Cie), and Kasongo (2Cie).


On the initiative of Chris Vandeput, in 1960 Sgt and section superior in the 1st platoon (Pel Cdt Ajd. KRO Jonhny Vanstipthout), he had planned a reunion of the ancients of the 16Detachment 2Cie in Diest, our first home base. This turned out very well and he was already making plans for another visit. Assisted by Leo Van Dyck also Sgt and section superior in the 2 Pel (Pel. Cdt lt. De Maere d'Artrygke), Schaffen was chosen. Both Diest and Schaffen brought back fond memories. Here we also had the honour and pleasure of



base. On departure with the Kamina to the Belgian Congo, we had to replace 1 Para's badge with the Korea badge. Unlike previous detachments, we were allowed to keep our wine-red cap instead of wearing

welcoming our 1960 Cie commander, General Toon Everaert. After Diest and the TrgCePara, a visit to the 3rd Bn Para could not be postponed.

The 3rd Bn ParaCommando was our second mother

He was a veteran of World War II and participated in the Battle of Monte Cassino (Italy), among others.

The bombing was an attack by the Official IRA on 22 February 1972 on the officers' mess of the Headquarters of the 16 Para Bde in Aldershot and was claimed as revenge for the so-called 'Bloody Sunday events a few weeks before. Padre Gerry Weston (RC Padre) was killed and six civilian employees (mainly female cleaners).

Officially, IRA member Noel Jenkinson was convicted and jailed for his part in the bombing. To mark this important event, the Aldershot PRA is holding a special event consisting of a Drumhead service (1200), unveiling of a new memorial at the site of the atrocity and a short march of veterans. America's wars and failures (Geopolitical Futures Comment (Austin, TX))

Friedman György, or George Friedman, was born in Budapest in Hungary to Jewish parents who survived the Holocaust. His family fled Hungary when he was a child to escape communist rule and first settled in a camp for displaced persons in Austria, then emigrated to the United States. Dr Friedman has briefed numerous military and government organisations in the United States and oversee, and regularly appears as an expert on international affairs, foreign policy, and intelligence in major media outlets. For nearly 20 years before he resigned in May 2015, Dr Friedman was CEO and then chairman of STRATFOR, a company he founded in 1996. Friedman received his Bachelor's degree from City College of the City University of New York, and holds a Doctorate of Government from Cornell University.

In his first article of the New Year, George reflects on America and its wars and concludes that America has forgotten on how important it is to know your enemy. By George Friedman (Founder GPF)

Sixty years ago, in 1962, the United States made the decision to go to war in Vietnam, deploying ground and air forces for the first time in combat. This was only a fraction of the manpower and aircraft that would serve there in the years to come. It was a frontier taken by the Kennedy administration, but saw US involvement as a small, even experimental step.

However, when a nation sees its soldiers go to war, a logic kicks in.

When men die, the nation assumes it is for a vital cause, and leaders cannot explain away the experiment because they cannot admit to having experimented on soldiers' lives. A death requires a worthy cause, and establishing that the death was not in vain is incompatible with "cutting and running," in the words of Lyndon B. Johnson. Intervening is difficult, but retreating under fire is agony.

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To understand US strategy between 1962 and now, we need to understand what John F. Kennedy saw and thought when he made the first major commitment. Kennedy had been shaped by World War II, and so had the senior military. In World War II, America understood its enemy. Germany was ruled by Hitler, and

- Hitler and his subordinates were smart, ruthless and, like us, fought a war of engines and industry.
- We understood that Hitler was an unscrupulous tyrant.
- Japan was an empire ruled by a brutal government and, as we saw in China, ruthless warriors.
- We also knew that, like the Germans and Americans, they were fighting an industrial war.

We knew the enemy, never underestimated its strength, and we timed our war so with industrial production.

- We knew the value of allies, the use of aircraft carriers and tanks, and how to train people to wage war. We mastered this and more, and we would fight to the end, no mercy asked or given.

The United States trumped North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in every measure that won the Second World War won, but we did not realise that we did not understand our enemy. They were not industrial, nor were they divided between communists and a range of factions. Clearly, the non-communists in the south hated the tyranny of the north. The anti-communist population was to be mobilised and armed with the best equipment, and the American flag, along with that of the Vietnamese, would fly over Hanoi. Crowds in the south would welcome the Americans even if the US did not take Hanoi.

How wrong you can be if you don't understand your enemy.

The purpose of intelligence is to predict what others will do, and just as the CIA did not understand the consequences of the Bay of Pigs (Cuba), it did not understand Vietnam. It was also stuck in World War II.

Vietnam was not the SS fighting the Maquis (French resistance fighters). Vietnam was divided by treaty, but it was one country. The communists had conquered the north and the non-communists ruled the south. The non-communists came in many forms, but the only thing they shared with the communists in the north was that they were Vietnamese. They were not so much shocked by a repressive communist regime as by the thought of a Vietnamese civil war, which the Americans were selling, whether they called it that or not. They did not want to fight others and all they wanted was to be left alone. The Vietnamese did not see the Americans as liberators and protectors, but they saw them as deliverers of the horrors of an industrial war. Having endured French occupation and oppression by Vietnamese who had turned the French into puppets, they had no intention of choosing between a new imperialism and a communist dictatorship. This did not mean that anti-

communism was not present, nor that many did not recognise the Americans as a friendly force. It did mean that the passions of the Vietnamese were divided, complex and volatile.

The Americans made three mistakes.

The US did not understand its enemy or its friends. They feared communists less than American public opinion. In wars, the darkest moment can be just before success, think of "the Battle of the Bulge" Battle of the Belgian Ardennes. The darkest moment could not be a moment like this because absurd claims of success had not prepared the American public for it.

If we think of not understanding the enemy, of shaping a war around the falsehoods of it and trying to overwhelm by industrial warfare an enemy fighting a very different war, we can also think of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. The enemy may or may not have hated the government, but plenty of people hated the Americans and their allies because they were not Iraqis or Afghans. Ideology and religion played a role, but they were not the solution they were a stranger in their home, and they had to expel him. Why don't we learn lessons from history, Americans should be fully aware of this. Our revolution was meant to drive out the haughty British, with their rules and regulations...have the leaders forgotten that? The revolution was committed to the Declaration of Independence, but the real enemy was the British. They were a stranger in our house, and they had to be driven out. The moral principle is there, but men die for the love of their own. There are few wars like WWI and II, thank God, but reasoning from how we won those conflicts.

Conflicts usually will lead to failure in other wars. The proliferation of US wars after World War II and their unsatisfactory outcomes should be massive evidence of this. Going to war and failing ... is leadership without discernment, with irrational belief in one's own strength and foolish rejection of the enemy's motivation and intelligence. Even if many welcome us as liberators. It will be these factors that determine our fate. Fortunately for America, it is too rich and strong to go down to failure, but it is important not to push your luck.

Wars are necessary and will happen, but they must begin as World War II began: with fear and awe of your enemy, because everything else makes you careless. As Thucydides noted, war cannot be waged from a divided and frightened city.

This was demonstrated in Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan. The most important question was never asked: What would the United States gain from victory, and what would defeat cost?

Defeat was never thought of, and the benefit of success was heavily overestimated. The world did not end, nor did US power, but fearing the consequences of defeat, we postponed the inevitable.

Today, the US is cooperating with Vietnam against China and so, what was unthinkable and unbearable then is neither today. Wars should therefore be rare, but absolutely necessary and not undertaken on an ill-conceived whim.

6.2. S.O.R. Special Operation Regiment.

6.2.1. The Commandos.

80 years ago in August 1942, the first Belgian troop Commandos was created in England, the 4th Troop of the 10th Inter-Allied Command. It was composed of volunteers from various Belgian units in England.

BELOIUM

After intensive training, the first candidates obtain their command certification at the "Command Training Centre" in ACHNACARRY.

Located in ABERSOCH, the Belgian Commando Company, under the command of Captain DANLOY, leaves England bound for ALGERIA. She will be the first Belgian unit to be engaged in operations.

In October 1943 it was deployed in IIALIA together with the Fifth Army.

In March 1944, the unit takes part in the defence of the island "VIS" (Yugoslavia) on the side of the partisans. Afterwards it rejoins England from where it will carry out a reconnaissance raid on the island of YRU (France) in June 1944

On 1 November 1944, the Belgian Commandos disembarked on the island of WALCHEREN, which was liberated after heavy fighting.

The various heroics and operations of this first Commando unit earn it the three following citations.

ITALIË - JOEGOSLAVIË - WALCHEREN.

6.2.2. De Paratroopers.

80 years ago in May 1942, the Belgian Independent Parachute Company was formed in England. It was composed of volunteers from Belgium and the four corners of the world who had fled to England. After very intensive training, the first candidates obtain their parachutist's licence at RINGWAY's "Parachute Training School nr1".

Located at FRITZHILL, the Belgian parachute unit, under the command of Captain BLONDEEL continues its training for about 2 years. The unit will be named "Belgian S.A.S. Squadron" and will be assigned to the notorious British S.A.S. "Special Air Service".

In July 1944, three squads of the Belgian Parachute Squadron will jump in FALAISE (France) and in August they will carry out missions in the French Ardennes. Two squads carry out missions in occupied NETHERLANDS for six months.

During the Ardennes Offensive in December 1944, the regrouped and armoured jeeps squadron carries out security missions for the benefit of the British Airborne Division.

This parachute squadron was the first Allied unit to set foot on Belgian territory (15 August 1944) and in Germany (5 December 1944).

The various operations and heroic deeds of this unit earned it the following mentions:

NORMANDIË - BELGIË - ARDENNEN - EMDEN - OLDENBURG

6.2.3. The Regiment Para-Commando.

70 years ago, the Regiment Para-Commando was created. It became an amalgamation of the Parachutists (Bn Parachutists at Diest) and the Commando units (Citadel Namur).

6.2.4. The Brigade Para-Commando.

In November 1991, the Para-Commando regiment became Brigade Para-Commando. It is composed of the following units.

The 7th Brigade consists of the following units:

- HQ Company 4 Commando Régiment
- Régiment 12e de Ligne Prince Léopold 13e de Ligne Light Infantry
- 2nd Commando Battalion
- 3rd Parachute Battalion
- Special Forces Group

History

The 7th Brigade was formed on 1 December 1948 as the 7th Infantry Brigade, taking over the traditions of the 7th Mixed Brigade, which was formed on 31 July 1914 and disbanded on 1 February 1918. Throughout its history, the 7th Brigade has had many different names. From 1957 to 1961 it was known as the 7th Infantry Group, from 1961 to 1969 again as the 7th Infantry Brigade, from 1969 to 1994 as the 7th Armoured Infantry Brigade and from 1994 to 2004 as the 7th Mechanised Brigade. In 2004, it was formally renamed the 7th Brigade. In 2011, it was merged with the Direct Response Cell to form the Light Brigade.

6.2.5. Special Operation Regiment: S.O.R.

- o On 2 July 2018, yet another reform. This reform allows Belgium to respond to geopolitical evolutions and the increasing number of threats it has faced in recent years.
- The Special Operations Regiment is one of the pillars of the Land Component. Thanks to the very lightweight nature of the units that make up it, the Land Component can deploy this capability very quickly.
- The Special Operations Regiment's headquarters is located in Heverlee (Leuven). This headquarters directs six units.
- o The Special Forces Group (SFGp) is the Regiment's elite unit. Its tasks are mainly unusual reconnaissance missions, raids and sabotages, in addition to supporting its own t- calls.

- o The 2nd Bn Commandos from Flawinne and the 3rd Bn Paratroopers from Tielen form the major combat units They are deployed both as rapid reaction units for NATO and Belgian forces, as well as for humanitarian missions and in support of the S.F.Gp.
- o The commando and paratrooper training centres are responsible for specialised training.
- In addition to those combat units, SOR also permanently has a unit to support them with communication and information tools adapted to their missions. The 6 Group Communication and
- Information Systems Group also has an additional paratroop commando capacity...

7.1. Overlijdens:

7.1.1. Marc Hayen

Was born in Leuven on 9 January 1951 and died at AZ Turnhout on 24 December 2021.

7.1.2. Vandendaele Pierre

War hero Pierre, who left with 'vélo' in Halle to drive out Germans, commemorated in Halle. As 22 January is his birthday, tribute was paid to Pierre Vandendaele on Saturday at the honour of the veterans of Halle cemetery. The Halle man died on Christmas Eve 2016 at the age of 93 and was the first Belgian commando to be trained for covert operations in the UK in 1942. For his war heroics, he was appointed Chevalier de La Légion d'Honneur, the highest national decoration in France. "It is normal that we want to commemorate such an exceptional figure every year from now on," said Leo Van Dyck of the Antwerp Veterans Parachutists and Commandos and member of the Leuven Regional, among others.

It was the first time Pierre Vandendaele had been commemorated so extensively at the place where he rests. Even Lieutenant Colonel SBH Fréderic Linotte, head of the Special Forces Gp, was present with his wife. A delegation of the 15th Détachement Para-Commandos and the Paracommando Friendship Circle of Leuven was also represented by Jos Aerts, with banner.

The mayor, Liesbeth Verstreken and alderman Danny Van de Velde. All came to pay their respects and flowers were laid down. Louis Stuyts blew the "Last Post". This all was attended by Pierre's grandson.

That more than five years after his death so much attention is still being paid to Vandendaele is because he was "gene gewone", as they would say now. In June 1941 after the capitulation of Belgium, as a young idealist of 18, he simply set off on his bicycle in Halle to do something against the occupying forces. At home on the table, his parents found a note 'I'm off'. His brother Roger was of the same calibre. He enlisted in the Piron Brigade and died at the end of the war

Pierre rode his bicycle as far as France, swam across the Somme, but was caught in France and detained in a labour camp. There he escaped on 14 July during celebrations for the bank holidays in France

He then crossed the Pyrenees only to be unfortunately immediately arrested in Spain and imprisoned in the famous Miranda de Ebro prison camp. After five months, he was freed and reached England via Gibraltar, where Allied headquarters were located. Volunteers from all over occupied Europe were trained as commandos there after rigorous screening at the training centre at Fort Williams in Scotland's rugged Highlands.

The 10th Commando Inter-Allied Troops were deployed to carry out dangerous and covert operations. The Zoerser did campaigns in Italy, Yugoslavia and France. During the landing on Walcheren (Zeeland) for the liberation of the Scheldt estuary in November 1944, he was badly injured and was even



paralysed for a while, which must have been a disaster for his parents, since brother died that same week at age 23 from a bullet in the head.

After the war, Pierre stayed in the army. He started a family, settled in Saint-Antonius and went to work. For the last four years of his life, Pierre lived with his daughter Michou, who was a veterinarian

"Old soldiers never die, they just fade away" was written on his prayer card. "With Pierre Vandendaele, an important eyewitness disappeared" says Leo Van Dyck from Halle. "He deserves to be remembered every year"
